Here the love of God, through Jesus is revealed in time and space. As we share in Christ the feast that frees us -

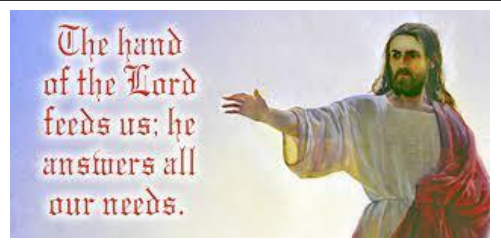
All are welcome, all are welcome. All are welcome in this place.

People are aware that public Masses have resumed, albeit with restrictions, and limited to attendance of 100 max (two pods of 50) in Assumption Church.

Funerals and Weddings are limited to 50 only attending in the church.

Our Sunday Masses times are the

Vigil on Saturday at 7pm, and 9.30am & 11.30am on Sunday mornings.

The obligation to attend Sunday remains suspended.

Weekday Masses, Monday to Saturday, are at 10am.

(The church closes after 10am Mass on Saturday for cleaning)

Funerals will normally be at 11.30am. However, in the rare event of two funerals needing to be held on one day, the regular 10am Mass will be cancelled, and the funerals will be at 9.30am & 11.30am, with the church reserved for 50 mourners.
